133 Finals: #4 Scotty Parker had the day's most spectacular move (above) – and one of our most eye popping since Rob Rohn's NCAA finals in 2002. It was a 6-point bear hug and lateral drop with 0:07 left to win 9-8 vs #3 Kaid Brock, Okla St (NCAA 4th in '17). Brock dominated the first 6:53 before Scott earned the Journeyman's Hammer Award as the OW, after three ranked victories to win his pool at 133.

These four also won their pools plus group final:

174- Jordan Kutler won 5-4 on riding time to beat #12 Jacobe Smith, Oklahoma State in a re-match of their University National Freestyle final. Smith transferred to OSU after winning two NCAA junior college national titles.

184- Ryan “Pit Bull” Preisch won in sudden victory, 4-2, over Virginia Tech junior, Zach Zavatsky, already twice NCAA #5 seed without placing. The “Preisch was right” in never letting go with fangs sunk on a leg at the edge and never letting ZZ get out of the “yard.”

125- No power outage here: Darian Cruz smoked an unranked* field, 52-11 (two TFs, 1 major) to get his motor running before the upcoming huge duals (Fri vs #5 Sean Russell).

157- Ian Brown has scored 11 or more in all four bouts this season. In Bout 1 in Troy, he led 14-0 before his WBF in 2:33; next he coughed up a 4-pt NF but won, 11-10; in the final he thumped Army's Weiland, 12-2. Leaving the mat, 'Bod' Brown earned an online post: “The LU strength coach deserves a raise.”

Drexel got the win w/out their two ranked men (184, 285). From award winning DesMoines Register: "Dresser expected some bumps, and a season-opening loss to a team scoring a combined 11.5 points at the last three NCAAs certainly qualifies."

DU coach Matt Azevedo (Iowa State wrestling alum) probably grinned and grimaced simultaneously; his staff incl Pitt NCAA 7, hwt Zack Sheaffer; Iowa's Josh Dzievia, Cornell's Joe Stanzione. Tot NCAA medals of staff: 1. Clutch? Dragons won last four by combined six points.

Take a 2nd look at the nation's top dual team, even before Tomasello's back. How possible with 5 champs above? It's thanks to two top transfers at 141, 165 ...said ASU coach Zeke Jones: ""We had several opportunities to put ourselves in a position to win the dual," perhaps referring to resurrecting Tsirtsis to NCAA champ form at 149, but Z should visit his eye doctor... Buckeyes lead 4-2 in the series after losing the 1st two at home in '85, '90 when ASU was a Top 4....OSU site: "Snyder's 12 takedowns were 50% more than the ASU team." Bully ... what to say after he, Bo & Tomahawk are all gone?
